

4. Master of Arts 문학석사(MA)과정

● 소개

The Master of Arts (MA) is a two-year program, which focuses on either counseling or educational ministries. The MA program is designed to prepare graduates for professional ministry as counselors and teachers either in the Korean or mission settings. The relevant departments specifically handle the curriculum of each concentration. For more information, refer to the Christian Education or Christian Counseling department.

4-A. MA in Christian Counseling (in English)

The English MA in CC curriculum is divided into two tracks: Track C-Counseling Ministry and Track S-School Counselor. Students must decide on their tracks at the student orientation before they register for courses for the second semester.

► **E MA CC - Track C. Counseling Ministry Track**

Students in Track C will normally complete the MA in CC program by taking courses in the following sequence. Students are required to take Clinical Observation in the first semester and practicum classes in the 2nd and 3rd semester. Students who wish to engage in more clinical practice could choose to take additional practicum and supervision in the 4th semester. There are additional fees for both Practicum and Clinical Observation classes.

► **E MA CC - Track S. School Counselor Track**

Students who are interested in providing counseling services in school setting should choose Track S. Upon successful completion of the School Counselor Track, students could seek ACSI School Counselor certification. Students in Track S will normally complete the MA in CC program by taking courses in the following sequence. Students are required to take Clinical Observation in the first semester and practicum classes in the 2nd and 3rd semester. Students who wish to engage in more clinical practice could choose to take additional practicum and supervision in the 4th semester. There are additional fees for both Practicum and Clinical Observation classes.

3. 5 credit hours from education elective courses
4. At least 3 credit hours from OT, NT and Theology courses** (For Bible Teacher Certificate only)

** Students who want to obtain BOTH Bible Teacher Certificate AND Secondary Teacher Certificate from ACSI may have to take at least 50 credit hours.

** Students who want to obtain the ACSI Professional Secondary Teacher Certificate ONLY may have to take at least 47 credit hours.
