Rooted in evangelical theology, Torch Trinity Graduate University invites everyone who dreams of engaging in domestic ministry and global evangelization through systematic theological education.




TTGU is an interdenominational theological institution that cultivates global leaders on the foundation of biblical evangelical theology. Degree programs are offered in English or Korean.

- The academic year at TTGU begins in the spring semester, at the end of February or the beginning of March.
- Some degree programs may be opened for the fall semester. Please refer to the school's website for further information.
- International and TSMS Program applicants must meet the qualifications outlined in Article 30 of the Enforcement Decree of the Higher Education Act.
- TSMS applicants must be a native of a strategic mission country and must apply from their home country or mission field. According to the mission of TTGU, the full scholarship includes an entrance fee, tuition, and dormitory accommodation, and it will be awarded upon admission.

Curriculum

Focuses on Professional Development and Spirituality

- Intensive courses that combine theory and practice from actual mission fields.
- MDiv Program: Small group supervision by faculty advisers through five semesters of mentored formation classes, followed by a senior seminar designed to reinforce the integration of theory and practice.
- Elective courses relevant to pastoral and missionary ministry can be taken concurrently (Spirituality, Counseling, Islam/Diaspora Mission, Preaching, Church Music, etc.).
- Invitations and networking with professional organizations to explore ministry sites and develop networks through Mission and Ministry Exploration Weeks each semester.





Certificates

- ACSI Professional Teacher / Principal / School Counselor Certificate Program
 Upon completing related courses and meeting other ACSI requirements, TTGU Students are eligible to obtain the certificate to work as a professional teacher, principal, or counselor at any membership schools of the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI).

 for counselor certificates from national
 (Korean) or related associations. TTGU
 offers required counseling courses and
 practicum at the Torch Trinity Counseling

Torch Strategic Mission Scholarship Program



Every year, as a part of the world mission, TTGU offers full scholarships with room to about 10 selected students from the missionally strategic countries. They receive systematic theological education and ministry training in Korea before returning to their home countries to commit themselves to church ministry and seminary education. Since TTGU's foundation, there have been more than 240 TSMS graduates working tirelessly to spread the Word of God in over 50 countries.











Angel Project

The Angel Project is a valuable ministry that encourages alumni to give their best for the kingdom of God. The project also serves as a foundation for the future establishment of a comprehensive mission network. A team of professors and students from TTGU visits graduates scattered around the world to support and serve many local ministries (leadership training, environmental improvement, medical service, children's service, etc.).
