

8. Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) 철학박사과정

● Introduction (in English)

The Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) degree in theology is a three-year program primarily designed to produce quality scholars who can effectively minister in institutions of higher education, especially in missional settings. The program largely focuses on facilitating independent research and will equip graduates to contribute competently to a specialized area of theological studies. The Theology Area is divided into four sub-areas which are Biblical Studies, Historical/Theological Studies, Intercultural Studies, and Educational Studies.
