

Master of Arts (MA) in Christian Counseling and Psychology

● Introduction (English Program)

The Master of Arts (MA) is a two-year program, which focuses on either counseling or educational ministries. The MA program is designed to prepare graduates for professional ministry as counselors and educators either in the Korean or mission settings.

The English MA in CC curriculum prepares students to provide counseling services in diverse settings. Students who are interested in obtaining ACSI School counselor certificate should take two additional classes.

- Students may replace the 'Research & Writing' course by submitting a sample paper (APA format, 5-6 pages, double-spaced, Times New Roman, 12-point font) and passing an editing test. To complete the process, students must apply for credit approval during the designated credit transfer application period and receive approval.
- Prerequisite courses are required in order to take sequence courses Clinical Observation (0) & Counseling Skills & Practicum (3) → Practicum I (1)
- If EMACC program students wish to pursue counseling-related certifications in Korea, they should contact counseling center for more information.
- Optional ACSI school counselor certificate required classes will be offered every 2 years as modular classes.

- For ACSI school counselor certificate, students should register for "CC5125 Group Dynamics and Counseling in Schools (3)" and "CC6175 Multicultural Counseling in Schools (3)".

►► MA CC Two-Year Schedule

Students will normally complete the MA in CC program by taking courses in the following sequence. Students are required to take Clinical Observation in the first semester and practicum classes in the 2nd and 3rd semester. Students who wish to engage in more clinical practice could choose to take additional practicum and supervision in the 4th semester. There are additional fees for both Practicum and Clinical Observation classes. Students who wish to pursue ACSI School Counselor Certificate should plan to take two additional classes, CC5810 Career Counseling (3) and CC5830 School Counseling (3).
