● Introduction (English Program)

The Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) in Theology is a three-year program primarily aimed developing quality scholars who can serve effectively in higher education institutions, particularly within missional contexts. The program emphasizes independent research, preparing graduates to make significant contribution to a specialized field of theological studies. The program is organized into four sub-areas: Biblical Studies, Historical/Theological Studies, Intercultural Studies, and Educational Studies.
