

Master of Education (MEd)

● Introduction (English Program)

The Master of Education (MEd) is a two-year program for current and future teachers and administrators who desire Christian integration in their vocation. It is mainly designed to produce Christian teachers and administrators capable of educating their students in primary and secondary schools from a biblical worldview. The program's emphasis lies on developing students' Christian worldview as well as their educational and administrative knowledge and skills through a variety of biblically integrated courses and practices. The program has two tracks: 1) Teacher Track and 2) Administrator Track. Teacher Track students can earn a professional teacher certificate from the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI). By taking additional courses, Administrator Track students can earn the ACSI principal certificate in addition to the teacher certificate.

** Students must fulfill the field education (FE) requirement in a local church or a Christian organization while they are enrolled at TTGU. To receive a P (pass) grade, the student should i) register for Field Education I-II and ii) submit the Field Education report to the Program Director, signed by the field supervisor, by the 15th week of the semester.
